

Measure

This week, we will think about the language we use to compare different amounts. For example, "that dragon is taller than the other dragon," or "there is more rice in this bowl, there is less in that bowl."

Ingredients

120g (1 cup) plain / All-purpose flour
140g (2/3 cup) caster sugar
1.5 tsp baking powder
A pinch of salt
40g (1/3 cup) unsalted butter, softened
120ml milk (whole milk if possible)
1 egg, large

\$\frac{1}{4}\$ tsp vanilla extract


For the vanilla frosting


250g icing /confectioners' sugar 80g butter 25ml milk a few drops of vanilla extract

How to make a paper lantern:

- 1. Cut off one end of the paper. Set aside to use as the handle.
- 2. Decorate the sheet using coloured pens, paint or glitter.
- 3. Fold your paper in half lengthwise along the dashed line.
- 4. Cut the marked lines along the sheet. (Do not cut to the edge of the paper).
- 5. Unfold the paper.
- 6. Match the long edges together on the lantern and use tape to hold it in place.
- 7. Staple the handle to the top of the lantern.


